LIVING THE WORD: APPROACHING THE PASSION

CHRIST FOR US: The Scriptures today assure us that what happened to Jesus in his Passion and Cross way back then was actually God at work through him, drawing us all into God's love. God was at work in Jesus FOR US:

- ♦ God loved us in his great mercy
- ♦ He brought us to life in Christ
- ♦ He raised us up with Christ
- He gave us a place in heaven with Christ

CHRIST IN US: this love of God at work in Christ continues in us with our believing. When we participate prayerfully in the liturgy of Christ's Passion back then, we are blessed through Christ's Passion here and now continuing in us: we share in the sufferings offered to the Father, so as to share in Risen life the Father shared first with Jesus and now with us.

So you are invited to join your "passions" to Christ's Passion

- Write on a red post-it note your own sufferings, scars, struggles and sins, and pin it to the cross in church
- Do the same for the woes and wounds you see in our world today, or someone else's suffering you know
- when we remember his Passion in the Easter Triduum, our believing will enable God to continue to bless us as he blessed Jesus—with the Easter life.

With the RCIA scrutinies for the new initiates at Easter we all benefit in the prayerful reflection and prayer for **purification** and enlightenment, and all of us together will be strengthened in what is upright, strong and good.
